No loading docks shall be constructed so as to be at the front of a building or fronting any street.

The City of Clinton, owner of Lot 14-1 (at the time of application), requested a variance to allow a potential buyer of Lot 14-1 to construct a building with a 35-foot set back from the street ROW, due to the location of the floodplain. This proposed building location exceeds the 25-foot I-2 zoning set back requirement.

The property was purchased by Bohannan Investments, LLC on April 8, 2024.

- b. Skimmer Digester Blower: Blower is operational. Changed the oil; now evaluating the belt. Will empty basin in order to re-pipe the digester. Work can be done by AWR. Upon completion, this item can be removed from the items in the WWTP Improvement Project.
- c. Manhole and Pipelining Rehab: 8 MHs to be rehabbed. Pricing is for a cementitious coating. PWC asked Jon to get pricing for a rubber coating with a longer life cycle. CIPP liner to be installed in 5 separate lines (2,000+/- l.f.).

- e. WWTP Improvement Project: Ross Construction is still working on revised pricing for selected project components.

ORDINANCE IMPOSING A PUBLIC SAFETY SALES TAX IN THE CITY OF CLINTON, MISSOURI, AT THE RATE OF ONE-HALF OF ONE PERCENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING PUBLIC SAFETY PURSUANT TO SECTION 94.902 RSMO.

WHEREAS, the City of Clinton is authorized to enact up to a one-half percent (.5%) sales tax to improving public safety services for the City, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Ordinance of the City Council of January 16^{th} , 2024 (the "Ordinance"), the City Council ordered an election to be held in the City on April 2^{nd} , 2024 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City the following question:

QUESTION

Shall the City of Clinton, Missouri impose a citywide sales tax at the rate of one-half of one percent (.5%) for the purpose of improving public safety of the City?

and the votes cast at said election were duly canvassed as provided by law, and it was found and declared that a majority of the qualified voters of the City voting at said election on said question voted in favor of the imposition of said sales tax;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLINTON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. With approval by the voters on April 2nd, 2024, and pursuant to the authority granted by Section 94.902 RSMo, and subject to its provisions, a sales tax of one-half of one percent (.5%) for the purpose of public safety services will be imposed upon all sellers for and upon all retail sales made within the City of Clinton of tangible personal property or the rendering of all taxable services at retail to the fullest extent allowable under Sections 144.010 to 144.525 RSMo and the rules and regulations of the Director of Revenue issued thereunder.
- Section 2. The rate of the tax shall be one-half of one percent (.5%) on all receipts from sale at retail of tangible personal property or taxable services at retail to the fullest extent allowable under Sections 144.010 to 144.525 RSMo, and the rules and regulations of the Director of Revenue issued thereunder.
- Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby ordered to forward to the Director of Revenue, by United States registered or certified mail, a certified copy of this Ordinance and the January 16th, 2024 Ordinance and an abstract of votes cast on the question at the April 2nd, 2024 election. The sales tax imposed by this Ordinance shall become effective on October 1, 2024 as provided by the Act, by Section 94.902 RSMo as amended, and by all other applicable laws, and shall be used for the purposes hereinabove authorized.
