

 - Sewer District Formation Update: Map of district has been completed. Will soon have election, authorized by Circuit Judge. No date has been set yet.



Subject: CPR-03 East Sludge Basin Concrete Repairs

This letter is in reference to the request for pricing for several alternates for repairing the existing concrete slab of the East Sludge Basin. We will not be providing a proposal for Alternates 1-2 as we believe the cost for these alternatives will be very expensive. The other concerns are the unknowns when you remove the existing concrete slab for soil remediation and the conditions of the subgrade below, which are expected to be extremely wet. We have assumed that the existing subgrade below the existing concrete is wet but not flowable. We have not included remedies nor costs if the subgrade is flowable and undermines the adjacent concrete slabs. We are providing a proposal for Alternate 3. We cannot guarantee the Basin will be watertight due to existing cracks and the possibility of movement of the slopes and floor slab. Our costs are as follows.


