Buyer shall appoint a representative familiar with the site and the nature of Seller's performance to be accessible at all times that Seller personnel are at the site. Seller shall not be liable for any expenses incurred by Buyer in removing, replacing or refurbishing any Buyer equipment or any part of Buyer's building structure that restricts Seller access. Buyer personnel shall cooperate with and provide all necessary assistance to Seller. Seller shall not be liable or responsible for any work performed by Buyer.

23. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW: Buyer shall comply with applicable laws and regulations relating to anti-corruption, including, without limitation, (i) the United States Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA) (15 U.S.C. §§78dd-1, et. seq.) irrespective of the place of performance, and (ii) laws and regulations implementing the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development's Convention on Combating Bribery of Foreign Public Officials in International Business Transactions, the U.N. Convention Against Corruption, and the Inter-American Convention Against Corruption in Buyer's country or any country where performance of this agreement or delivery of Goods will occur.

24. The indemnifying party shall defend the other party in accordance with and to the extent of the above indemnification, provided that the indemnifying party is: i) promptly notified by the other party, in writing, of any claims, demands or suits for such damages or injuries; ii) given all reasonable information and assistance by the other party; iii) given full control over any resulting negotiation, arbitration or litigation, including the right to choose counsel and settle claims, or the indemnifying party's obligations herein shall be deemed waived.

The parties hereto agree any orders placed by Buyer for Seller to provide Goods, regardless of any terms and conditions on any quote, purchase order or other documents exchanged, the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall prevail.

Medical

Quotes for medical insurance were solicited from Blue Cross Blue Shield KC (current provider), Midwest Public Risk (MPR), Aetna and United Healthcare. BCBS provided an initial renewal quote with an 8.9% increase, then revised it to a 6.9% increase. MPR, Aetna and United Healthcare declined to provide quotes. They all felt that their rates would not be competitive after reviewing the available employee medical data.

The City's 2025 monthly contribution for employee medical coverage is \$716.73. This aligns with the median premium rate for the five (5) BCBS plans that are offered. The 2026 quotes have a 6.9% increase for each plan. The median monthly premium rate in the quote is \$766.18. I am recommending that the Council approve \$766.18/mo. for employee coverage in 2026.

The two (2) plans with lower rates are both HSA plans. Currently, as in the past, the difference in the rates is deposited into the HSA accounts for those participants. The two (2) higher rate plans are low-deductible PPO plans, which are buy-up options.

Dental

Quotes were received from BCBS and MetLife, the current provider. While the BCBS monthly premium is slightly less than MetLife, MetLife offers \$500 more in coverage per year. I am recommending that we continue with MetLife.

Life

The Standard Life premium rate and benefit amount for the city-funded basic plan will remain the same for 2026. The City has provided The Standard coverage for many years, due to the *Line of Duty Benefit*, which is a unique benefit for Public Safety employees. Employees may purchase additional coverage.

FY 25-26 Budget Impact

Enclosed is a chart, *Employee Benefits*, with information showing the impact on the FY 25-26 budget.

Vision

Vision coverage is also included. It is optional and is paid by the employee. I am recommending that we continue with MetLife.

REF: Englewood Cemetery tree removals

When we solicited bids for the removal of trees from Englewood Cemetery, our budget was \$45,000:

- \$15,000 MO Dept. of Conservation grant
- \$15,000 City of Clinton match
- \$15,000 Englewood Perpetual Fund

The \$30,000 contract with Stoyko Tree Service (\$15,000 MDC grant / \$15,000 City match) has been executed, and Change Order #1 was issued to utilize the commitment from the Englewood Cemetery Perpetual Fund. In order to utilize as much of the additional \$15,000 commitment from the Perpetual Fund as possible, a list with 16 additional trees was submitted to Stoyko for quotes. Six (6) trees from that list were added to the 26 trees in the original bid package, for a total of 32 trees.

There are still 10 trees for which we have quotes, totaling \$24,800. The Perpetual Fund has approved an additional \$12,400 in funding, if the City will agree to an additional \$12,400 match in funding. That would allow us to remove a total of 42 trees with this project.

REMINDER: Cemetery staff removed 17 trees prior to soliciting bids.
